

## A Tribute

Dec. 3rd, 1944, will be remembered by the Jewish nation as one of sorrow and affliction because on that day, Rabbi Schloime Heiman, the Rosh Yeshiva of the Mesifta Torah Vadaath, passed from this world. His loss will be felt, not only by the students of the Mesifta, but by the entire Jewish nation because all of us, directly or indirectly, are beneficiaries of his greatness.

Great men usually make us aware of their greatness and we constantly feel that there is a great gap separating us from them; but Rav Schloime was truly great and yet like a father and friend. He radiated warmth and kindness. His sweet smile and kind words gladdened our hearts. His wise and noble thoughts enriched our minds. Some of us, perhaps,

were unaware of the tender and good "Rebi" we possessed. Only now, after his death, when we keenly feel our great loss, do we all realize what a heavenly personage we had with us. Rav Shloime was a perfect image of "Yiddishkeit" and "Yiras Shomayim," a walking "Shulchan Aruch," and a possessor of so much Talmudical knowledge, that few in this world can compare with him.

Let us be consoled by the thought that, actually our beloved teacher has not died, because the Torah and "midos which his many disciples learned from him will live with us eternally. Let us resolve to strive with all our might to perpetuate all the spiritual guidance which we received from our "Rosh Yeshiva."


