MR. FELDMAN: You're making a joke, aren't you?


REUVEN: What's a joke, Mr. Feldman?


... Even in the classrooms we have some interesting discussions about health: GOTTFRIED: But Rabbi Lew, laxative-type drugs are also habit forming.


HARRY (drowsily): Tomato sauce.


SPORTS





 - ו) אין המלמדים רשאים לעשות שום מלאכה לרבות ספרות במעמד תלמידיהם, פן יבטלו מתלמוד ולא יכלו למלאות חקם, ויהיו נקיים באומנותם שהם חייבים לעשות מלאכת שמים באמונה.
 - ז) הקהל צריך לקבוע "בית מדרש" דהיינו ישיבה גדולה לכחורים המקבלים עליהם עול תורה אצל בית הכנסת לחבר שתיהם יחד, מקום לתפלה ומקום לתלמור, וילכו מחיל אל חיל. וכמו שמעמידים חזנים להוציא רבים ידי חובתם מן התפלה, כך מעמידים תלמידים קבועים להמות בתורה בלי הפסק כדי להוציא רבים ידי חובתם מתלמוד תורה.
 - ח) צריכים להעמיד משגיח על התלמידים "לתת שיעור על תלמודם ולראות פקחות הנערים ועצלנותם. ואם יראה המשגיח בתוך הנערים נער קשה ואטום יביאהו לאביו ויאמר לו: השם יוכה בנך למעשים טובים כי לתלמוד תורה הוא קשה מאוד, פן ילכו הנערים הפקחים בשבילו אחורנית, ולא יקח מעותיו בחנם פן יחשב לגזלן ושמא ילך הנער אצל מלמד אחר ויצליח שם לפניו."

כותב החקים לא שכח את הבעלי כתים ויתר העם. כתב שתקנו חכמים לעסוק בשבת במלאכת הקודש לדרוש תורת אלקים להסיד מכשול ולהרים המוקש כדי שיהיז נזכרים מדברי אלקים חיים, וכן דרשו חכמינו ז"ל "ששת ימים תעבד ועשית כל מלאכתיך ויום השביעי שבת לה' אלקיך" פי' לשם ה', כי לשון מנוחה שייך אצל האדם שהוא עייף ויגע מעסקיו, וזאת המדה אינה אצל הבורא יתברך שמו, ע"כ פי' "לה' " - לשם ה', לעסוק במלאכת הקודש לדרוש בתורת האלקים ולהרים מכשול מתוך הקהל ולהרבות זכות וצדק עליהם ולהדריכם בדרך ישר, וכך משפט הגדולים הקרובים למלכות לעסוק בעבודת המלך בששת ימי המעשה וביום השביעי יעסקו בתורה ויזכרו דברי אלקים חיים כמו שנאמר "למען תהיה תורה ה' בפיך" לכל הפחות יום אחד בשבוע, ונאמר "לא ימוש ספר תורה הזה מפיך והגית בו יומם ולילה."

כלי חמדתנו

יש שתי תכונות שונות למצות לימוד התורה משאר מצוות עשה שבתורה. תכונה הראשונה היא שמצוה זו אינה אלא ע"י יגיעה כמ"ש "והגית בו יומם ולילה." וכן ברכת התורה וכל מאמרי חז"ל הם בלשון "יגיעה" או "עסיקה." ותכונה השני היא שמצוה זו שולמת בכל רגע ורגע כמאמר הפסוק "לא ימוש ספר התורה הזה מפיך." ולא עוד אלא שאמרו חז"ל "המהלך בדרך ושונה ומפסיק ממשנתו ואומר מה נאה אילן זה" — ר"ל אף שמשבח הקכ"ה בזה — מכל מקום "מעלה עליו הכתוב כאילו מתחייב בנפשו."

ומעם ההבדל במצוה זו הוא מפני שתכלית התורה היא להעלות ממדריגה למדריגה בעבודת ה'. וכתוב בספרי שהדרך להשיג את ה,,ואהבת את ה' אלקיף" הוא לקיים את ה,,ודברת בם." ולא עוד אלא שכל תכלית התורה אינה אלא העבודה כמאמרם ז"ל ,,חבל אל דלית ליה דרתא ותרעא לדרתא עביד." ולפ"ז קל להבין החילוק במצוה זו. שהרוצה להשיג את תכלית התורה לא מפסיק רק במה שהוא לומדה אלא צריך לעסוק בה בכל רגע ורגע, בשבתו בביתו ובלכתו בדרך. דווקא באופן זה שנותן כל מוחו, כל לבו, וכל נפשו בתורה, וליצה"ר ותחבולותיו אינו משאיר מקום, רק אז יוכל להגיע לתכלית האמיתי של התורה.

ובזה מובן חשיבות מצות לימוד התורה עד שאמרו חז"ל ,,ותלמוד תורה כנגד כולם." ולא עוד אלא שכל העולם אינו עומד אלא על מי שעוסק בתורה שרק ע"י עסק בתורה אפשר לעלות בעבודת הבורא כמו שאמרו חז"ל ,,לא עם הארץ חסיד." ואם כן פשום שחשובה התורה כנגד כל המצוות שלימודה מביא לידי קיום כל המצוות וכל חשיבותה אינה אלא משום המעשה כמו שאמרו חז"ל ,,גדול למוד תורה שהלימוד מביא לידי מעשה."

ולפי זה שכל גדלות התורה היא משום המעשה יש להכין מאמר חז"ל "כל העוסק בתורה לשמה תורתו נעשית לו סם החיים וכל העוסק בתורה שלא לשמה נעשית לו סם המיום וכל העוסק בתורה שלא לשמה נעשית לו סם המות" שהלומד שלא לשמה אין שום פעולה בלימודו, ובפרט כשלקנטר הוא לומד שבכתרה של תורה הוא משתמש אז שפיר "נעשית לו סם המות," משא"כ הלומד לשמה שיכול להגיע עי"ז למעלות גבוהות בעבודת ה' פשוט הוא דתורתו "נעשית לו סם החיים."

קרבנות בגלות

ענין של תפלה שתקנו אנשי כנסת הגדולה יש לה חשיבות כקרבנות כמו שמצינו בגמרא "תפלות כנגד תמידין תקנום", "כל המתפלל בבית הכנסת כאלו הקריב מנחה מהורה" וכמו כן "כל הנפנה ונומל ידיו ומניח תפילין וקורא ק"ש ומתפלל מעלה עליו הכתוב כאלו בנה מזבה והקריב עליו קרבן." וגם כן מצינו שיש לקרבנות שייכות לתפלה שבשעת הקרבת הקרבנות היו הלויים משוררים שירי דוד כמו שכתוב "כי ביתי בית תפלה יקרא לכל העמים."

ורבנו יונה השוח קרבנות ותפלה "ששניהם צריכים כונת הלב ומחשבה מהורה ושיתנדב האדם את עצמו להיות עובד ה' בכל לבבו ובכל נפשו ובכל מאודו." שבאמת כל המצוות זיכה לנו הקב"ה כדי שנהי' ראויים לקבל מוב עולם הבא שנאמר "ה' חפץ למען צדקו יגדיל תורה ויאדיר."

ומצות בנין בית הכחירה, כתב החינוך, אינה אלא להכין הלבבות לעבודתו יתעלה שכשיבוא אדם להקריב קרבן בירושלים, ויעמוד על הארץ שדרכו בה האבות, ויתקרב אל מקום הקודש, מקום שהשכינה שורה שם, ויראה עשרה הנסים ודאי יחשוב בלבו "החרדת קודש" ויתחנן בתשובה שלמה לפני ה'. ובהכרתו של שפלות עצמו וגדלות ה' ירגיש ממש ה,,על כל נשימה ונשימה תהלל י-ה" וישבח את ה' על כל החסדים שהפליא לעשות עמו מילדותו עד עתה. ובהכנה זו יקריב קרבנו שהוא גופה שחימת בהמת עצמו ובזמן כזה שהוא במדרגה החשובה יתקיים השחימה. ובתוקף יראתו יתפלל לפני ה' שיתרצה קרבנו להיות תחתיו: דם קרבנו יחשב כאלו נורק דמו, הקטרת האברים יחשב כאלו נקטרו אבריו. וכל זה מצד הודאה והתנדבות להיות משועבד לחי העולמים עד שיתן כל דמו, כל כחו, וכל גופו לה'.

ומזה נראה שעיקר קרבנות הוא התרגשות הנפש בתפילה ועיקר התפילה גם כן הקרבת הנפש לפני ה' שלאחר שמשבחים אותו שהוא מקור הברכות ועל כן לו לבדו ראוי להתפלל צריכים לבוא ולהשתעבד עת עצמינו ולהקריב כל נפשינו לעבודתו.

בשביל התורה שנקראת ראשית

"בראשית ברא אלקים את השמים ואת הארץ" — בראשית — אחז"ל "בשביל התורה שנקראת ראשית, בשביל ישראל שנקראו ראשית." ונראה מדרשה זו שתכלית הבריאה היתה בשביל התורה ועם סגולתו שיקיימו אותה. ולולא תורתינו הקדושה לא היה צורך בכל הבריאה כולה כמ"ש "אם לא בריתי יומם ולילה חוקות שמים וארץ לא שמתי."

הנה אותם כ"ו דורות שנתקיים העולם קודם מתן תורה היה רק חסדו יתב"ש, ומפני זה כתוב בתהלים כ"ו פעמים "כי לעולם חסדו." ולא עוד אלא שאפילו אצל הר סיני אמר הקב"ה "אם תקבלו את התורה מומב, ואם לאו שם תהא קבורתכם" כמאמרם ז"ל בשבת. וביאר בעל החפץ חיים דכל העולם היה חוזר לתוהו ובוהו אם לא היו מקבלים התורה, ושפיר מדוייק הלשון "שם" דהכוונה היא שבכל מקום שיהיו שם ימותו.

וכבר ידוע שהתורה קדמה לבריאת העולם ולא עוד אלא שמצינו לחז"ל שאמרו בבראשית רבה "היה הקב"ה מבים בתורה ובורא את העולם." וממדרש זה יוצא לנו מוסר השכל גדול עד מאוד שנוגע לנו היום.

בביאור המדרש יש להקדים מנהג עולם החילוני בהקמת חוקים למדינה. קודם מתיישבים אנשים על שמח ידוע, ותכלית היישוב היא מנוחה לתושביו. אולם כדי להבמיח שלוותם הולכים אח"כ בני היישוב ומתקנים להם ספר חוקים שקובע סדרם לבין עצמם. ומובן מאיליו שאין חוקים אלו תכלית היישוב כי אם דבר נחוץ הוא לתיקונו של היישוב ותושביו. ולכן נתונים הם לשינויים לפי רוח הזמן שיתאימו למצב החיים של בני היישוב.

ולדאבונינו קמו בזמננו אנשים שונים מבני עמנו שהשוו את תורתנו לספר חוקים חילוני. לפי רות הזמן רוצים הם להתאים את מסורתנו ולשנות את דרך חיינו עד שנלך יד ביד אם העם שבתוכו אנו מפוזרים. אלו הם האנשים שנעלמה מהם כוונת מאמרם ז"ל "הבים הקב"ה בתורה וברא העולם" — שלא הסתכל בעולם ועל פי מצבו ייסד ספר חוקים, אלא להיפך שברא העולם על פי התורה. והשקפה זו צריכים אנשים אלו לקלום, שלא נתקנה התורה בשביל העולם אלא "בראשית — בשביל התורה שנקראת ראשית."

ועכשיו יש להסביר חלק "ישראל — שנקראו ראשית." שהתורה שהיא נצחית נתנה ע"י הקב"ה שהוא נצחי לעם ישראל שהוא נצחי — וזהו "ישראל, אורייתא וקוב"ה חד הוא." ואם היותינו עם סגולה מומל עלינו החוב שנקיים את התורה ועי"ז יתקיים העולם.

אולם יש להבין שקיום החוב איננו פשום ככתיבתו. שהקב״ה ברא בעולמו שני כוחות, יצר הרע ויצר המוב. והנה יצר הרע נמשך כוחו בלי גבול שמתאים הוא מאוד לחלק החומרי שבאדם. וכ״כ קל ליפול ברשותו עד שאמרו חז״ל "אלמלא הקב״ה עוזרו לא יכול לו״ — והפי׳ הוא דבלי סייעתא דשמיא אי אפשר להתגבר על היצר "כי לב האדם רע מנעוריו.״

ולדאבונינו נראה היום לעינינו הפקוחות את שליטת היצר בתושבי אומות העולם שאף עם מלכותם וחוקיהם נעשו הם עבדים לגופם. וכל זה לא הפסיק להם עד שהגיעם בהמיותם למדריגה כה עצומה שאחד בולע את חבירו בחייו. וזה נגרם ע"י חסרון היראה ממלכותם, ושינוי החוקים לפי גודל התאוה.

ויש לנו להבין שיסוד ההיזק נובע כמה שלא זכו לתורה דהלא אחז"ל בקידושין "ברא הקב"ה יצה"ר ברא לו תורה תבלין." ולזאת התורה זכו רק ישראל "בראשית."

Lastly and significantly is the experience I have gained from my first venture into the "troubled" world, which I feel is so much more "aware" and "alive" than "troubled."


Thank you also Moti, Bobby, Lenny, Moishe J, and the rest of the staff for your devotion, effort, and support.
