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
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
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Inasmuch as it is customary for the Editor-in-Chief to write a forward, I will set down a few lines.

Bent on reducing his overcrowded classes, Rabbi Wolfson issues his famous edict of "No navie, no here"


Junior Year

C. Freund: "Yeah, they use square roots."





Athletic Terror

The scene is a hotel in New York City. An elevator lands in the cordoned-off lobby and out steps a group of grim-faced young men with size 19 collars, shielding their faces with their sleeves and hats. They are ushered into a fleet of waiting limousines with guns bristling out of them like automotive porcupines and are whisked away in a wail of motorcycle escorts. An arrest of a narcotics ring? No, they are members of the Colt football team on their way to a secret rendezvous in the Super Bowl with Dallas. Where the game will be played, and when, is a state secret. A group of insurrectionists calling themselves the "Aaron Bur Society" has threatened to kill the entire team from end to end, unless the U.S. Government accedes to their demand that the state of Louisiana be given to them to set up their own country. The Super Bowl will be televised nationally from a location known only to a few men, after all identifying geographical telltales have been masked or hidden.

(Erie, Pa. Nov. 30—National Press Service)—Mrs. Ann Mason sued the U.S. Government for \$800 Million dollars and moved to set aside her son into the national athletic pool. Mrs. Mason said the national player draft was unconstitutional, despite passage of the 34th amendment enabling it. Mrs. Mason declared: "I didn't raise my son to be a split-end or in any other hazardous occupation where he will be called upon to risk his life in the cross hairs of every fanatic in the hemisphere. The government has no right to force a young man into uniform—be it football, baseball, or track." The White House countered that it was in the national interest to have athletic games continued. "Some of us have to make the sacrifice. Unfortunately, it will have to be those who can run faster or jump higher than their peers".

Are the above just fanciful distortions? Orvellian logic? Hyperbolic overkill? Okay, consider the following absurdity that came clattering over the news wires one morning in Sept. 1972.

(Munich, Sept. 5)—An Arab terrorist team vaulted into the Olympic village today, shot two members of the Israeli Olympic delegation and held nine others hostage until their demands were met that the entire group be given safe conduct out of Germany. At the airfield, ambushed by German sharpshooters, the terrorists slaughtered the remainder of the Israeli athletes. Believable episodes? No, surely they are right out of a screen fantasy. The critics will come up in a moment and say "Alfred Hitchcock." Or consider this melodrama:

(Bucharest, October 10)—The United States Davis Cup team—which rejected Romanian requests that it leave two Jewish members of its team at home, as well as any Jewish officials, coaches, or fans—has arrived in the Romanian capital, where they are kept sequestered and virtual prisoners on the 17th floor of their hotel. The Romanian secret police has sealed off not only the floor the Americans are living on, but also the floor above and the one below. Armed patrols scour the corridors, and the athletes are forbidden to look out the windows or otherwise present an inviting silhouette. Under heavy guard they are whisked

to and from the cup matches in bullet-proof cars. Is that just another horror story? No, unfortunately, unlike the two flights of imagination about New York City and Erie, the Munich and Bucharest scenes really happened.

When did athletes become instruments of national policy, fair game for street fanatics, the morbid nationalists, the haters? You shoot archdukes, not tennis-players, right? You attack a troop train, not a trainer. Wrong. Athletes are the new "royal families" of our culture. A national athlete lying dead sends a far greater chill down the spine of the average citizen than does a martyred Prime Minister.

How did this happen? It seems it first began with the Nazi Olympic Games in 1936. The pageantry in Berlin was a showcase of political ideology as a tyrant marshalled an entire nation to bray to the world the superiority of an evil ethic. Unnoticed in the furor was the refusal of the Fuehrer to shake hands with black track star Jesse Owens and the fact that two Jewish sprinters were dropped from the U.S. relay team. Suddenly it (the Olympics) became not a bunch of guys running around in underwear, but a deadly clash of ideologies.

It was in this atmosphere of bogus national self-interest that the Olympic Games came to Mexico City in 1968 amid rumors of student unrest. The President of the International Olympic Committee paid a visit to the president of Mexico. The president of the committee said, "if revolution should break out or demonstrators break up the games, perhaps it would be better to transfer them to Los Angeles, which was waiting in the wings". The president of Mexico shook his head. The students will not demonstrate, he promised.

(Mexico City, October 2, 1968—Combined dispatches)—An undisclosed number of women, children and students were killed tonight in a bloody shoot-out between police and 6,000 demonstrators, mostly students, who were in the Plaza of the Cultures demonstrating the military occupation of the National Autonomous University campus. A helicopter suddenly appeared overhead and dropped a flare, and, as if at a singal, white-gloved, carabine-bearing policemen appeared on balconies surrounding the plaza and opened fire into the demonstrators. Conflicting reports put the dead at between 48 and 200. The Mexican Olympics opened 10 days leter, with insurgents lined against impassive-faced troopers. But slaughter has come again to the Olympics, as it would once more in 1972.

Must the Games perish or be played inside a ring of cannons or on a lone and secret, shark-surrounded isle? Hard answers must be found, or sports may find itself staring permanently down the barrel of a submachine gun held by a shadow character in a stocking cap. His nationality is unimportant. He belongs to a universal brotherhood. His name is Fear.

ספגתי מכות רכות, וברור שאת "התשובה" לא שכחתי. והסאדיסט בא עוד פעם לחקור אותי ושואל:

> מאיפה אתה? מאיזו ארץ? ", מהרתי לענות "אני מפלסטין".

"שקרן יהודי נכזה! ״, פורץ הוא בזעם של מירוף, "איך אתה מעלה על פיך שם כה מקודש "פּלסמין,״ והוא הוריד על ראשי ועל רמ״ה איברי מכות רצח. על אף כל היסורים האלו, שמחתי כשראש הסוהרים בא. היות והיה לו שעון מאיר עם "תאריכון״, ותמיד התאמצתי בכל כוחותי לראות את התאריך, שמחתי שהוא לא תפס את הסוד שלי. לפעמים לא הייתי במוח מתי שבת, והייתי מסופק האם התבלבלתי או לא

זכורני בשמחת תורה ידי היו כבולות בשלשלאות כמו תמיד, ובהיותי לבד בחדר נזכרתי שהיום זה שמחת תורה. התחלתי לשיר "ותן חלקנו בתורתך". רקדתי בשכיבה על הבמן, והרגשתי כאילו אני אוחז בספר תורה ורוקד בביהכ"נ בארץ.

ומצפים לישועה

"הן עם לבדד ישכון וכגוים לא יתחשב" (כמדבר כ"ג, מ), מפרש רש"י שעם ישראל לא מתחסל מן העולם כמו אומות אחרות. ומבאר המלבי"ם שאומות אחרות אחרי כמה שנות קיום, האומה מתערבת עם אומה אחרת וכך מתבטלת האומה הראשונה. משא"כ עם ישראל שהוא עם שמתקיים כבר אלפי שנה ולא התערב עם אף אומה. נשאלת השאלה מה אוחז את העם מלהתבטל, אם אינו מתערב עם אומה אחרת ולא מקבל כח מאף אומה, ויש והיה לעם ישראל שונאים לאורך כל דרכו מאז היותו לעם. וא"כ מה נותן לו כח להשאר ולהתקיים כעם? והתשובה היא שזו כוחה של אמונה כמו שכתוב "והיה אמונת עתיך חסן ישועות חכמה ודעת, יראת ה" היא אוצרו" (ישעיה ל"ג, ו). ופירשו המפרשים שהנביא מתכוון לומר שאפילו שהפסדתם במלחמה הרבה תחמושת כמו שכתב בפסוק קודם "ואסף שללכם אסף החסיל" (ישעיה ל"ג, ד). היות וע"י שהפסדתם באופן גשמי נתגברה האמונה ברבש"ע וזה נותן חוסן, כח וחיזוק להמשיך להאמין בו ולהתקיים. עד שמגיעים לזמן שיכולים לומר בלשון הוה "הנה אלוקינו זה קיוינו לו ויושיענו, זה ה" קיוינו לו נגילה ונשמחה בישועתו" (ישעיה כ"ה, מ) וביאר המלבי"ם שעם ישראל יאמר, הנה אנחנו רואים שמה שקיוינו לו ובמחנו והאמנו בו לא היה לחנם ומעכשיו נגילה ונשמחה בישועתו לעולם.

אבל הקושיא נשארת שגם לאמונה יש גבול וא"כ למה עוד לא באה הגאולה? והתירוץ הוא שיש לדעת ולהבין, אמונה מהי? הגמ' (בסנהדרין דף צ:) מביאה על שאלה מעין זו, מתי יבוא כבר המשיח? שהתירוץ הוא היום, אם בקולו תשמעון ויש להבין כוונת הגמרא. בפרשת בהר כתוב, "וכי תמכרו ממכר לעמיתך או קנה מיד עמיתך, במספר שני אל תונו איש את אחיו. במספר שנים אחר היובל תקנה מאת עמיתך, במספר שני תבואות ימכר לך" (ויקרא כ"ה, יד-מו). דהיינו אם עבד נמכר למשל בי' מנה, וזה י' שנים לפני היובל, מחלקים את מחירו במספר השנים שהוא יצטרך לעבוד. ועל כל שנה שהעבד ירצה להשתחרר יצטרך לתת את המחיר הזה. וממילא יוצא שאם העבד ירצה לצאת בשנה השניה הוא יצטרך לשלם ח' מנה שזה הרבה יותר מאשר העבד ירצה לצאת בשנה השמינית שאז יצטרך לשלם רק ב' מנה. ואם לא ישלם בכלל ג"כ ירצה לצאת בשנה השמינית שאז יצטרך לשלם רק ב' מנה. ואם לא ישלם בכלל ג"כ יצא רק בזמן הקצוב לו. כן הוא לגבי הגאולה. ודאי, שהגאולה תבוא בסוף הזמן שנקצב, אבל אם רוצים לצאת מהגלות קודם אז צריך לשלם ע"י מעשים טובים, וכל כמה שמתקרב הזמן שתהיה הגאולה המחיר נהיה נמוך יותר.

הגמרא (בסנהרין דף צח. ובירושלמי תענית פ"א ה"א) דורשת על הפסוק "אני ה" בעתה אחישנה" (ישעיה ס", כ"ב). זכו אחישנה לא זכו בעתה. והפירוש הוא כמו שהסברנו דאם עם ישראל יצברו ומספיק זכויות ישתחררו קודם זמנם בדיוק כמו שהעבד מתי שיביא כסף ישתחרר ואפילו לפני זמנו. וכך גם עם ישראל ישתחררו לפני הזמן הנקצב בגג המצוות שעושים עד עכשיו. אבל אפילו אם לא יזכו ודאי שיבוא היום שאז יגאלו ואפילו אם לא ישלמו כדי להפדות, וזה הכוונה "לא זכו בעתה." וזה ג"כ כוונת הגמרא שהמשיח יבוא היום אם בקולו תשמעו. שאפילו שזה לא הזמן שנקבע מראש בכ"ז אם בקולו תשמעו יגאלו קודם הזמן כמו שהעבד יכול להשתחרר קודם הזמן שנקבע מראש. ואם זו היא האמונה כבר לא שייך לשאול מה הגבול של האמונה? כיון שהזמן יכול להיות אפילו עוד מאות שנים אבל הרי אם יעשו מעשים פובים יקדימוהו וכל יום תוכל להיות הגאולה.

ויאמינו

הרמב"ם בתחילת ספר המדע פ"א הלכות יסודי התורה פוסק שכל אדם צריך לדעת שהשי"ת כרא את השמים ואת הארץ והוא שלים בהם ובד' רוחות העולם. זכן מבואר בפירוש הרמב"ן על התורה שהפסוק "אנכי ה' אלקיך" וגו' שהוא דברה ראשונה מעשרת הדברות, הוא מצות עשה באמונת אלקים ואחדותו בעולמו. על פי רוב הדעות, האמונה בהקב"ה אינה רק ענין הנאמר בפה, אלא שצריך האדם לצייר בנפשו את יחודו של הקב"ה. וכל מה שיכול לחקור, חייב לחקור בענין הזה כפי השגתו, משום שעיקר המצוח היא הידיעה האמיתית, כמו שהיה אצל אברהם אבינו. וזה מה שכתוב "וידעת היום והשבת אל לבבך" (דברים ד), שעל ידי עיון השכל וחקירת הלב בייחוד השי"ת, תבוא לידי השגת הלב, כלומר, שתהיה יותר קרוב להשי"ת. וכן מבואר בס' חובת הלבבות שרק על ידי אמונה שלמה ובטחון מוחלם בהקב"ה, יכול אדם לבא לידי עכודת אלקים. והאמונה צריך להיות חקירה בלב כל אדם מכיון שהוא יסוד כל התורה, ומי שאינו מאמין בזה, הרי הוא ככופר בטיסר.

וכן הוכא בשם הרב הגאון ר' יחזקאל מקאזמיר, ביאור בדברי המדרש של
"אז ישיר משה רמז על תחית המתים". שבאמת עיקר העבודה של כל אדם היא
האמונה והאמת המומלת על כל יהודי להאמין בכל לבו באמונה פשומה. ולא שידע
על ידי ראיה ברורה שכך הוא, מכיון שבאופן הזה חסר לו אמונה, ויש לו ידיעה
במחשבתו שהדבר אמת בודאיות. ומאחר דאיתא בחז"ל "שראתה שפחה על הים
מה שלא ראה יחזקאל בן בוזי", לא היה שייך עוד אמונה, היות וכל ישראל ראו בגלוי
את מעשי הקב"ה, וצריכים לומר שמ"מ נשאר בהם אמונה פשומה, והיא ביאת
משיח שאותה לא הראה להם הקב"ה לעיניהם, וא"כ יש מקור לתחית המתים מן
התורה.

ומצות האמונת בהשגחה פרטית היא החיוב לדעת שהקב"ה הוא שורש כל הנמצא בעולם, ומבלעדו אין שום כח לברוא כדכתיב "אין עוד מלבדו" (דברים ד). וכן צריך לדעת אדם שהשי"ת הוא בורא עולם האמיתי שהוציאנו ממצרים, ומנהיג את כל העולם במאמרו, ואין לו קץ או הפסק. הידיעה שאנו חייבים לאהוב את השי"ת ולעובדו, וכל האנשים נתונים תחת שלטונו והשגחתו, היא בגדר מצות האמונה. ענין זה כפי מה שכתב הכלי יקר לתרץ את הקושיא הידועה למה רק בשני דברות הראשונות נתגלה הקב"ה לישראל? אך הענין הוא, שבשני דברות הראשונות שהם "אנכי" ו"לא יהיה לך" נתגלה החיוב של אמונה פשוטה, ודרך העם הוא, כשרואין את פני המלך בעצמו מקבלים עליהם את עולו, ולאחר קבלת העול מתחייבים לשמיע עליו את עול המלכות, אינו מחויב לשמוע את מה שנודע לו שהוא צוואת המלף. לכך נתגלה הקב"ה אל כל ישראל בשני דברות הראשונות שהן תחלת מתן תורה וקבלו ישראל את עול מלכותו עליהם, וכששלח הקב"ה את משה רבינו להגיד לישראל את דברי התורה, היו מחויבים לשמוע לו.

ובענין גודל מעלת האמונה והבטחון, איתא במדרש כל מה שישראל אוכלים בעולם הזה אינם אוכלים אלא בשביל שכר האמונה. דהיינו, האמונה היא המצוה היחידה שמקבלים שכר בשבילה בעולם הזה. וכן כתבו כל הספרים הקדושים שלא זכו ישראל ליציאת מצרים על ידי עצמם משום שהיו משוקעים בגשמיות והטומאה, רק שהקב״ה ברוב חסדיו קיים מה שנשבע לאכרהם אבינו. אבל בקריעת ים סוף היה כדאי שיעשה הקב״ה ניסי הים לישראל בשביל האמונה, כמו שאמר הכתוב "ויאמינו בה' ובמשה עבדו". הדבר ידוע שאחד מן השלשה שאלות ששואלים את האדם כשמביאין אותו בפני בית דין של מעלה הוא, אם צפית לישועה?

ואף שהחיוב להאמין בביאת המשיח אינו מפורש בתורה, מכל מקום יש לדבר רמז בפסוק "אנכי ה' אלקיף". והיינו שכשם שאדם צריך להאמין ביציאת מצרים שהיתה על ידי הקב"ה, ע"כ צריך להאמין שהקב"ה יוציאנו מן הגלות. שכמו שהקב"ה ראה את צרות היהודים בגלות מצרים וריחם עליהם וגאלם, כך בודא" ברחמיו וחסדיו יוציאנו גם מגלות זו. וזהו ההסבר במאמר חז"ל, "כל אדם שיש בו דעת כאילו נבנה בית המקדש בימיו". שאם יש לו דעת להבין ולהאמין שהקב"ה ברא את העולם בכחו, כך יש בו התקוה לראות את הישועה, ובמוח שהשי"ת יחזיר שכינתו לציון ובמהרה יבנה המקדש. ועל ידי האמונה הפשומה והתמימה נזכה לביאת משיח צדקנו במהרה בימינו.

,,ימי שנותינו כהם שבעים שנה וכו' ורהכם עמל ואון כי גז חיש ונעופה." אם נעמיק בדברי דוד המלך, נראה שבשנותינו הקצרות רוב זמנינו מבוזבז במרדות העולם הזה. ובכדי למנוע את זה, בא וראה את גודל חיוב ניצול הזמן ללימוד התורה, ואפילו זמן קצר.

החפץ-חיים מביא חשבון שבכל דקה יכול אדם לומר מאתים מילים, וכיון שבכל מלה של תורה האדם מקיים מצות עשה של תלמוד תורה, הוא יכול לקיים מאתים מצוות עשה של תלמוד תורה כל דקה. וכל מצוה מהמאתים מצוות האלו שקולה כנגד כל המצוות כולם. ומהאי מעמא פסק הרמב"ם בהלכות תלמוד תורה שאם יש לאדם ברירה בין מצות תלמוד תורה לבין מצוה אחרת שיכולה להעשות ע"י אחר, הוא מחויב לעסוק בתורה, כיון שבכל מלה בה הוא מקיים מצוה ששקולה כנגד כל המצוות. לפי"ז מובן הפלא יועץ שאומר ,,ועתיד ליתן דין וחשבון [על בימול תורה] ואפילו על זמן מועם כדי בליעת רוק". וכמו שמפרש הגר"א שדין זה עונש על מעשה העבירה וחשבון זה עונש על הזמן שהתבמל ע"י עשיית העבירה, זמן שיכל לשמש לקיום מצות תלמוד תורה.

ואם האדם מכזכז את הזמן לשוחח שיחת חולין, מלכד ביפול התורה שיש בזה, הוא עובר גם בעשה של "ודברת בם" ולא בדברים אחרים. וודאי שכשהוא מדבר לשון הרע ורכילות הוא עובר על עוד כמה לאוין. וכן כתוב "כי שתים רעות עשה עמי, אותי עזבו מקור מים חיים לחצוב להם בורות, בורות נשברים אשר לא יכילו המים." לא די מה שעוזבים את ד׳ אלא גם עוברים איסורים.

ולכן ברור מה ששמעתי מאחד מרבותי, שיש פתגם ידוע ",זמן זהו כסף", והפתגם הנו מעות גדולה, ודעה כוזכת ועקומה היא. ויותר נכון הי' לומר שבמקום להרויח כסף הי' יכול לנצל את הזמן לקיים מצוות ששכרם בהאי עלמא ליכא.

באתי במילים האלו לעורר את עצמי וחברי, למלא את זמנם בתורה ומעשים מובים. כפי שיד כל אחד ואחד משגת. ואם ילך בדרך זו בודאי יחי' בנחת רוח. ויהנה משמחתה של תורה, כמו שכתוב "פקודי ד' ישרים משמחי לב." ובזכות התורה והעבודה נזכר לשובה וברכה לשני ימות המשיח ולחיי העולם הבא.

על שלשה דברים העולם קיים, על האמת ועל הדין ועל השלום" (מסכת, "על שלהבין מה הקשר בין שלושת הדברים הללו.

כתוב בפרשת יתרו שמשה ישב לשפום את העם מן הבקר עד הערב. רש"י ז"ל הקשה, וכי אפשר לדון מהבקר עד הערב? אלא מסבירה הגמרא (במס' שבת דף י' ע"א) שבגזירה שוה מהמילים "בקר" "וערב" בבריאת העולם אנו לומדים שהעוסק בדין אמת נעשה שותף להקב"ה במעשה בראשית.

עוד כתוב ,,מלך במשפט יעמיד ארץ ואיש תרומות יהרסנה" (משלי כ"ט) דרשו רז"ל, אם דיין דומה למלך שאינו צריך כלום, אז יעמיד ארץ, ואם דומה לכהן שמחזר על הגרנות (לתרומה), אז יהרסנה (סנהדרין ז עמוד ב') ורואים מכאן שעל ידי אמיתות הדיינים יש לארץ קיום.

יש משל בספר משלי החפץ חיים, שפעם אחת שני ילדים באו לאביהם. אחד אמר "האם אתה זוכר את המנה שנתתה לי? אחי קפץ ולקח אותה ממני, ואע"פ שידעתי שאני הצודק, הבנתי שאין רצונך שאני אריב אתו, לכן אבקש ממך לתת לי את המנה שבאמת מגיע לי." בוודאי, האבא של הילד הזה יהיה גאה בבנו. והנמשל הוא הקב"ה. שאם יש אדם שיתפלל לה' ויאמר, "אתה יודע שראובן גנב ממני כסף, ואני רשאי לקחת ממנו בכח את הכסף ששייך לי, אבל אני יודע שאין זה רצונך. לכן אבקש ממך לתת לי את כספי." אדם כזה הקב"ה אוהב, ורוצה להתקרב אליו ולהיות אתו בכל צרותיו היות והוא מתנהג לפי המדה של אהרן אוהב שלום ורודף שלום.

יש לדקדק, למה ניתן הקיום לישראל דווקא, והלא בעולם יש גוים — שבעים אומות? והתירוץ הוא שכתוב ברש"י ז"ל (בפרשת בראשית א', א') "לא נברא העולם אלא בשביל ישראל שנקראו ראשית". ואם ישראל הם הסיבה של הבריאה, גם קיום הבריאה צריך להיות על ידם. והיסוד של המשנה הוא ללמד אותנו איך אנו יכולים להתקרב אל הקב"ה ולקיים עולמו, שאנחנו צריכים להשתתף עמו בקיום, ואי אפשר להשתתף אתו רק אם יהיה אמת בין בדין ובין בחבירות. והרי אם אין שלום לא יכול להיות דין אמת, כי אדם לא ירצה לבוא לדין אם חבירו. ואפילו אחרי הדין של אמת, אם אין שלום אין תועלת בדין אמת כי אחרי הדין צריך אדם להגיד שאני בוודאי מעיתי ואם יראה הקב"ה את זה, בוודאי יהיה לו נחת מברואיו. ונוכל להיות יותר קרובים לבורא העולם, ויהי' קיום לעולם. והקב"ה ירחם עלינו וישלח את משיח צדקינו בקרוב בימינו, אמן!

כתב הרמכ"ן ושאר ראשונים שכשמגיע יום הדין, ב"ד של מעלה מדקדקים ביותר על עבירות שנעשו בפריקת-עול ובפרהסיא, ובפרט בזמן שהעולם מופקר מהמצות. המעם לזה הוא שכאשר יש מרידה נגד מלכות שמים, מתחלפים החוקים ויתכן שיענישו עונש חמור, עבור עבירה קלה. בזמנינו, דור של עקבתא דמשיחא, רואים אנו את גודל החשך והסתר בעולם וכן את קיום הפסוק "ואנכי אסתר אסתיר פני" (דברים ל"א - יח). ליהודי הנמצא בחשך הזה, אשר "בו תרמס כל הייתו יער" (תהילים ק"ד - כ) אסור להתייאש ולומר "על מי יש לנו להשען, על אבינו שבשמים" אלא צריך למלא את תפקידו בעוה"ז "לעשות לו ית' דירה בתחתונים" (תנהומא נשא מ"ז), ביתר שאת וביתר עוז.

כדי להאיר את החשך הכפול ומכופל, גילה מורינו הבעש"מ זי"ע דרך חדשה בעבודת ה', על ידי שפתח שערי פנימיות התורה. תנועת החסידות שגילה היא אור פנימי ופנימיות האור, ותפקידה להאיר את העולם ולהראות לו את דרך הישרה. הבעש"מ, ה,,זה ינחמנו" של תקופת עקבתא דמשיחא, עשה את ההכנה והכלי לגילוי המשיח. ידוע שכאשר שאל הבעש"ם את מלך-המשיח "אימתי קאתי מר," ענה לו מלך-המשיח "לכשיפוצו מעינותיך חוצה" (אגה"ק של בעש"ם) ולכן עיקר העכודה בדורינו היא לפעול בענין הפצה, פיזור במרחב רב, שיגיע תורת ה' לכל קצוי תבל גם לפשום שבפשומים וגם לאלו שמחוץ לכל המחנות שהתורה מעידה עליהם, שהם "חוצה". מצינו בכתבי האריז"ל, והמגן־אברהם מביא את זה להלכה, שבערב שבת אחר חצות צריכים למעם ממאכלי שבת ככתוב מועמי' חיים זכו. מכיון שתקופתינו היא בבחינת ערב שבת אחר חצות, צריכים עכ"פ למעום את מעם העתיד-לבוא שהוא "ישקני מנשיקות פיהו". וכפירוש רש"י אלו מעמי תורה שיתגלו לעתיד. יוצא מזה שכיון שהגאולה תהי' לכל ישראל, ממילא צריכה גם הפצת מעיינות הבעש"ם להיות ההכנה לגאולה לכל ישראל. מובא בספרים שהפסוק "ובני ישראל יוצאים ביד רמה" (שמות י"ד-ח), מתורגם "בריש גלי", ומרומז על ר' שמעון בר יוחאי (ר"ת ברי"ש) ככתוב בזוה"ק "בספרא דילך יפקון מן גלותא בחסד וברחמים." ממילא מובן בפשמות, שע"י הפצת תורת הרשב"י והבעש"ם (שג"כ אותיות ברי"ש) והנשארים ממלאי מקומו, ישלימו הכוונה העליונה לעשות לו ית' דירה בתחתונים. ויתקיים היעוד "ומלאה הארץ דעה את ה'" בגאולה השלימה והאמיתית ע"י משיח צדקינו, למטה מעשרה מפחים, ובקרוב ממש.

למען קיום התורה

אמת שבכל דור ודור עומדים עלינו לכלותינו. בעבר היו ליהודים הרבה צרות, וגם כהוה יש להם הרבה צרות. אבל כמו שבכל דור ודור היה ניצוץ שהחזיק וקיים את התורה והמצוות, גם בזמן הזה יש ניצוץ. בני ישראל ידעו תמיד שרק על ידי כח התורה הם יחיו ויתקיימו, ועל ידי הכח הזה אנחנו חיים וקיימים היום.

ידועה היא אמרתו של ר' יוחנן בן זכאי, כפי שסיפרו חז"ל, (במסכת גימין דף נ"ו עמוד ב"). "בעי מינאי מידי דאתן לך", מאמר איספסיינוס קיסר שהחריב את ירושלים. ורבי יוחנן בן זכאי השיב לו "תן לי יבנה וחכמיה" (פירוש רש"ר "תן לי יבנה — שלא תחריבנה ולא תהרוג חכמיה" ...). ושושילתא דרבן גמליאל (רש"י "משפחת הנשיא, שלא תהרגם ושלא תכלה שולמנות בית דוד" . . .) ואסוותא דמסיין ליה לרבי צדוק (רש"י "רופאים תן לי מאנשיך, שירפאו את רבי צדוק, שלא היה יכול לבלוע אוכל לפי שנתקצרו מעיו מתעניותיו" . . .)

ועל זה אומרת הגמרא — קרי עליה ר' יוסף ואתימא רבי עקיבא, "משיב הכמים אחור ודעתם יסכל"... איבצי למימר ליה לשבקינהו הדא זימנא, והוא סבר דלמא כולו האי לא עביד והצלה פורתא נמי לא הוי. (פירוש רש"י, "כולי האי — דלישבק לירושלים לא עביד ליה ואישתכח דאפילו פורתא לא עבדי")

והנה איך אפשר לחשוד שרבי יוחנן בן זכאי הסיח את דעתו, חס וחלילה, מלהציל את בית המקדש ברגע שנפתח איזה פתח להצלה? אלא שיש מצבים קשים שעל פי-האמת קשה להכריע מה לעשות. אם לדרוש מעם בהתאם לאימרה "תפסת מרובה — לא תפסת, תפסת מועם — תפסת". או לנצל את שעת-הכושר ולבקש הכל.

זוהי שאלה שאין עליה תשובה מוחלמת, ולכן ניתן לומר שר' יוחנן בן זכאי עצמו הרהר בזה, ולא מצא מנוח לעצמו. כי אולי לב של אספסיינוס היה מוב עליו ברגע זה ולא היה מסרב למלאות אפילו בקשה כזו שלא לפגוע בבית המקדש? והרי העובדה היתה, שכל מה שביקש ר' יוחנן בן זכאי מיד קבל ואספסיינוס לא היסם כלל.

מאידך גיסא, הרי בכל זאת קבעו חז"ל "תפסת מרובה לא תפסת, אפילו מועט." צריך לחשוב גם בכיוון ההפוך, שאילו ר' יוחנן בן זכאי היה מבקש יותר מדי לא היה מקבל כלום, ואפילו יבנה וחכמיה" לא היו נשארים לפלימה?

לפיכך נראה לומר שר' יוחנן כן זכאי הרגיש שבשביל קיום התורה והיהודים לדורות הבאים צריך להציל את ג' דברים האלו: א) יכנה וחכמיה, שהם יהיו הניצוץ שיאירו את התורה בשביל הדורות העתידים לבוא. ב) שושילתא דרבן גמליאל — שלא תכלה שולטנות בית־דוד, שזהו גם כן בשביל קיום התורה והיהודים לעתיד, כי מבית־דוד עתיד לצאת המשיח שיצילינו מצרותינו. ג) ואסוותא דמסיין ליה לר' צדוק והכוונה בזו באמת היה שר' יוחנן בן זכאי אכן השתדל לרמוז לאספסיינום קיסר, שברצונו לבקש על בית המקדש. ("תן לי את רפואתו של ר' צדוק" כך ביקש. וכלום צריך להוסיף מה היתה הרפואה הזקוקה לר' צדוק? הלא ר' צדוק היה מתענה כל השנים שבית המקדש לא יחרב, ואם כן מן הדין היה שאספסיינום יבין את הרמז ויסיק את המסקנה הנכונה. ואם תשובת הקיסר היתה כי ישלח אליו רופא, הרי בכך סירב להציל את ביה"מ). ובאמת אנו רואים שר' יוחנן בן זכאי בחר את הצלת בית המקדש שהיא יסוד נפשינו שבו שרוי' השכינה, וממילא צדק ר' יוחנן בן זכאי על מה שביקש למען הצלת קיום התורה לעתיד.

סוף ימי גיטו וורשא

בשם: הגנרל זורגן סטרא€, הממונה על גיטו וורשא. 1943 למאי, 13 למאי,

הנושא: פעולה הנוגעת לגיטו וורשא.

המקבל: שר הפנים איכמן.

התחלנו בשעה 10:00 בבקר, סקרנו את הגיטו, 234 יהודים נאסרו, הרגנו מהם. מצאנו שאותם היהודים שנשארו כגיטו התאספו יחד בכדי למרוד ולהלחם בנו. הנאסרים הם אנשים ונשים מגיל 18 עד 25, הם נתפסו בתוך מקלט קטן בצד הגיטו. להפתעתינו, הם נלחמו בנשק קל וכבד וזרקו רימונים. התנהלה בינינו מלחמה קשה, לבסוף הצלחנו להוציא את הברנשים האלו מהמקלט. התחלנו לבדוק את בגדיהם של הנתפסים, באמצע פעולת החיפוש ילדה הוציאה רימון מבגדיה וזרקה אותו על אנשינו, ושלשה מחיילינו נהרגו. היהודים שנשארו במקלט נהרגו כאשר הפצצנו את המקלט.

מספר היהודים שנשארו בגימו נכנסו לחורבות והוציאו משם אוכל ותחמושת. בזמן האחרון, היהודים שתפסנו אינם מוכנים לגלות סודות על היהודים שנשארו, על אף כל היסורים שהם קבלו לפני שהוצאו להורג. מבית חרשת אחד הוצאנו

327 יהודים ושלחנו אותם למרכלינקא.

לסיכום — עד היום תפסנו 55,179 יהודים. נהרגו שלשה עשר חיילים. מצאנו 6 אחדחים, 2 רימנים ויוד תחמושת. גמרנו ב-9:00 בערב, מחר נתחיל בשעה 10:00 בבקר.

בשם: הגנרל זורגן סמראפּ, הממונה על גימו וורשא.

וורשא, 16 למאי, 1953

הנושא: פעולה הנוגעת לגימו וורשא.

המקבל: שר הפנים איכמן.

התחלנו כשעה 9:00 בכקר. הרגנו 180 יהודים שתפסנו אמש. השכונה היהודית בוורשא איננה קיימת כבר. מלאכת "זורשא" נגמרה בשעה 8:15 בערב, כאשר הפצצנו את בית הכנסת הגדול ש^ל זורשא. אדמת הגימו היא תחת יד שר משמרת וורשא.

לסיכום — עד היום תפסנו 56,065 יהודים. כולם הוצאו להורג, מלבד 631 יהודים. 794 חיילים גרמנים נהרגו במשך כל הקרבות בוורשא. רק שמונה בנינים הראוים לשמוש נשארו.

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
