רבי שלמה הימן נולד בעיר פריטש פלך מינסק. בילדותו התנכר בין ילדי העירה בחמימותו וצניעותו. בעודו רך בשנים נתפרסם כילד-פלא. בגיל צעיר, בא ללמוד בישיבת "כנסת בית יצחק" בסלובודקה. ראש הישיבה רבי ברוך בר ליבוביץ, שנתפרסם אחר כך כראש ישיבת קמיניץ, ראה בתלמידו כובכ חדש עולה בשמי היהדות, והתמסר מאד אל תלמידו. חיש מהר נתפרסם בעולת הישיבות, והשם רבי שלמה פריטשר נעשה לשם דבר. רבי שלמה נעשה לתלמידו המבוקש של רבי ברוך בר, ורבו אהב את תלמידו באהבה גדולה עד למאד.

באיוו מדה, באיוו חביבות ובאיוו הערצה העריך רבי ברוך בר את תלמידו רבי שלמה, יעיד המכתב שכתב אליו רבו אחרי כמה שנים: "טרם כל אודיע לרום גאוננו ידיד נפשי אשר לפי ידיעתי בי, כי אוכל לומר כי רום גאוננו הוא ממשחי החיים שלי. כי אוכל לומר כמו שאמר גאון אחד על עצמו: שכדאי היתה לידתו וחבלי לידת אמו עבור מה שחידש בתורה לחרץ בסוגיה אחת דברי הרי"ף. כן אמר לעלי, כי כדאי היתה לידתי, וחבלי לידת אמי, עבור שזכיתי מהשם יתברך להעמיד תלמיד כרום גאוני שיחיה, אשר הוא יושב בישיבה ומפיק מרגליות בתורה לבחורי חמד, ודבריו מאירים בתורתנו הקדושה."

מישיבת "כנסת בית יצחק" הלך ללמוד לישיבת רדין, להסתותף בצלו של החפץ חיים. על פי בקשה החפץ חיים נעשה רבי שלמה לראש ישיבה בישיבת סמילויץ. בשנת תרפ"ג נתמנה לראש ישיבה בישיבת ברנוביץ. בשנת תרפ"ח הזמינו הגאון רבי חיים עוזר גרוודינסקי, רבה של וילנה, לכהן בתור ראש ישיבת רמילס בוילנה. שמו של רבי שלמה נתפרסם בכל הישיבות אשר במדינת ליטא, ועד הישיבת באמריקה הגיע שמו הטוב של ראש הישיבה הצעיר.

בשנת תרצ"ה הזמינה הנהלת ישיבת תורה ודעת והמתיבתא את רבי שלמה להיות ראש הישיבה. משהגיע רבי שלמה לישיבת תורה ודעת, נתפרסמה הישיבה כמדינת אמריקה ובכל העולם כלו, וטובי הבחורים התחילו נוהרים אליה מכל העברים.

עשר שנים רצופות הגיד רבי שלמה שיעורים, בישיבת תורה ודעת, ולא מש מאהלה של תורה, עד ימים אחדים לפני פטירתו. מאות תלמידים למדו תורה מפיו, ומהם רבנים ידועי שם, המשמשים כיום בקהילות חשובות או כראשי ישיבה מפרסמים.

צדיק תמים היה רבי שלמה, יושב באהלה של תורה, שוקק והוגה, מעין ולומד, ואחר כך מלמד לאחרים. עקר שאיפתו בלמוד היתה החיפוש אחרי האמת. משנתו היתה קב ונקי, אבל בעקב השפיע על תלמידיו באישיותו הנפלאה. הוא היה כלו רך וכלו רגש, תמים ובר-לב, האמין בכל לבבו ונפשו, באפשרות תחית התורה גם באמריקה. הוא היה אומר: "מלא כל הארץ כבודו" ואף אמריקה בכלל. התנהג עם תלמידיו בשיבה ונחת, ובצהלת פנים שופעי ריך ועדנה. הביט עליהם כמו אב המביט על בניו. חס היה על כבוד תלמידיו ולא נתן להם לשמשו. ענותנותו הטבעית ואהבתו הגדולה לכל בן תורה חבבו אותו על כל בני הישיבה.

בדרך למודו הלך בעקבות רבי עקיבא איגר. היה מדיק בכל מלה ומלה, בדברי רבי עקיבא איגר. פעם התבטא לפני תלמידו, כשרבי עקיבא איגר אומר: "וה' יאיר עיני העורות", מלים אלו לא היו דברי מליצה. רבי עקיבא איגר לא דבר במליצות, אלא פשוט הרגיש כאשר חסר לו ידיעה אחת בתורה העולם חשך בעדו. וככה למד לתלמידיו לחפש תמיד, את נקדת האמת שבתורה. שעה קצרה לפני פטירתו, ספר לאלה שישבו על יד מטחו שראה בחלומו את רבי עקיבא איגר, אשר אור תורתו האיר לפניו תמיד את אורח חייו.

רבי שלמה הלך ערירי ולא זכה לבנים. תלמידיו הרבים, אשר העמיד במשך חייו, הם בניו אשר השאיר אחרי מותו. ועד היום מעריצים אותו תלמידיו, ומזכירים את שמו ביראה, בתהילה ובחביבה. בן חמישים ושש היה במוותו. תנצב"ה.

הוא היה אומר: חביב אדם שנברא בצלם, חבה יתירה נודעת לו שנברא בצלם, שנאמר כי בצלם אלקים עשה את האדם. חביבין ישראל שנקראו בניים למקום. חבה יתרה נודעת להם שנקראו בניים למקום שנאמר בניים אתם לה' אלקיכם חביבין ישראל שניתן להם כלי חמדה חבה יתרה ידעת להם שנתן להם כלי חמדה, שנאמר כי לקח טוב נתתי לכם תורתני אל תעזבו (פ"ג מ"ח)

התנא בא ללמדנו היתרון הגדול שיש לעם ישראל בבריאת גופם, יותר על שאר האמות. שיש להם צלם קדוש מעל ראשם המונע אתם מן החטא. ושלישים יום לפני פטירתו של אדם מסתלק הצלם הזה מעליו. והשבי"י וחבריו בהיותם בני אדם קדושים היו מכירים באדם לפני פטירתו שהוא הולך להסתלק מן העולם הזה, שהם הכירו בצלם הזה, ונקט התנא בלשון חביב אדם. כיון שאדם הראשון נברא בצלם זה(ב) ומלבד החיבה הזאת העניק לנו הקב"ה עוד מעלה שהודיענו שברא אתנו בצלם זה. שאם אדם נותן מתנה לחבירו ומודיעו, המתנה יקרה יותר חביבין ישראל שניתן להם כלי חמדה והודינו התנא כל זאת, כדי לזרז את האדם לעשות רצון יוצרו שברא אתו ונתן בו נשמה טהורה ויקרה החצובה מתחת לכסא הכבוד.

וחשב התנא ג מעלות לישראל לפי שהאדם יוכשר וישתכלל בגלל ג סיבות. האחת אם מצד תולדתו, שנולד במזל טוב, ואם מצד יחוסו, א מצד לימודו.

חבה יתרה נודעת להם, שלא תאמרו זה שקרא הקב"ה לישראל בני בכרי ישראל עדיין אינו אמר שהם בניים אלא חבה קרא להם בניים. חזר התנא ואמר, חבה יתירה נודעת להם, היינו שהיה הדבר ידוע שהרי משה רבינו קרא להם בניים אתם לה' אלקיכם, וכשהדבר מפורסם זלוי לכל שהם בניים למקום.

וזה שאמר התנא: חביב אדם בודאי לא שייך לייחס לה' צלם ודמות אלא ביאר הענין שניתן לאדם כח אלקי היא הנשמה וכגם שהשי"ת ניכר רק מצדה הגתו בעולם. כך ניכרת הנשמה רק על ידו פעולותיה הנגלות, אבל מצד עצמותה נעלמתיו כמוסח. ונאמר ומבשרי אחזה אלוקי שמהנפש יכול אדם להכיר בורא שאמרו בזה"ק שכל הנזהר ממאכלות אסורות יש לו צלם אלקים והאכילם מסלק הצלם.

והתנא בא להודיענו למה בחר הקב"ה בישראל יותר מבכל האמות לתת להם התורה אע"פ שכלום יציר כפיו של הקב"ה ואמר, אמנם חביב אדם שנברא בצלם, שהאדם חביב יותר משאר בעלי החיים בלתי מדברים הואיל יהוא נברא בצלם, וכשם שדבר זה ברור וגלוי לכל, כך ברור הדבר שחביבין ישראל שנקרא בניים למקום שחביבים ישראל יותר משאר כל האמות. וכשם שחבן חלק מאביו כך ניתן לישראל מזג וחומר זך שהם להטים אחר המצות וגם מצד נשמתם שהיא חלק אלוך ממעל. ולכן ניתנה להם כלי חמדה, היא התורה שכל מה שאדם משיג בה חומד להשיג בה יותר

וכיון שחביב אדם שנברא בצלם אתה צריך לכבד כל יצור, שאמרו חז"ל שאסור לבייש אבני מזבח על ידי עליה במדרגות ולכן אסור לעשות מעלות למזבח ודרשו קיין ומה אבנים הללו שאין בהם דעת להקפיד ואמרה תורת שלא תנהג בהם מנהג בזיון חבירך שהו בדחות יוצרך על אחת כמה, כמה, ואם כן יש ליזהר מאד בכבוד הבריות.

## המושג של בחירה

מצינו בגמרא (בבא בתרא ט"ז) שאלה יסודית בענין הבחירה:

אמר רבא: ביקש איוב לפטור את כל העולם כולו מן הדין. אמר לפניו: רבונו של עולם, בראת שיר פרסותי סדוקות, בראת חמור פרסותיו קליטות (וכל בא על ידיך - רש"י) בראת גן עדן בראת גהינם, בראת צדיקים (על ידי יצר טוב - רש"י) בראה רשעים (על ידי יצר הרע לפיכך אינו ניצל מידך) מי מעכב על ידיך (אניסין הן החוטאין - רש"י) יתוכן הקושיא זה מה האפשרות לאדם לשנות טבעו, הלא כל התרונות של אדם זומם לפני לידתו. באמת מדוע הם החוטאין אחראים למעשיהם. הלא כל יצרות, כל חלשות וכל כוחות של אדם קביעים לפני ביאתו לעולם. הרי כל רשע שחטא בידיו להצדיק עצמו לאמר, הלא לא יכולתי למנוע את עצמי כי כבר נגזר מן השמים שאני אהיה רשע, מה אני יכול לעשות?

ומאי אהדרו לי חברי לאיוב? — אף אתה תפר יראה ותגרע שיחה לפני קל (פירוש: גם קושייתך זו מחסרון יראה, ומסירה יראת שמים של אחרים) ברא הקב"ה יצר הרע ברא לו תורה תבלין.

לכן צריך לימר שכל אדם יש לו בחירה לעשות מה הוא רצה. אם הוא רוצה לילך בדרך ישרה (על ידי תורה תבלין שלו), זה בידו, ואם רוצה לילך בדרך רע (על ידי יצר הרע שלו) גם זה בידו. וזה ענין גדול ויסוד של תורתנו. אם גזירת ה' היתה שאדם אחד יהיה צדיק ואדם אחר רשע, מדוע צוה ה' את אותנו על ידי הנביאים לעשות כך ולא לעשות כך, להטיב עצמנו ולא ללכת אחר יצרנו. אם טבענו היה נגזר מתחלת בריאתנו לילך באיזה דרך ולא נוכל לעזוב אותו? אם כן, אין כאן מקום לתורת ה'.

אולם התבוננתי בתירוצם של חברי איוב ותמהתי בלבי איך אפשר לאדם לעשות מה שהוא רוצה, הלא הוא אינו יכול לזוז כל שהוא בלי רשותו של הקב"ה וכמו שמצינו בספר תהלים (קלה) כל אשר חפץ ה' עשה בשמים ובארץ בימים וכל תהומות?

אבל הנראה מדברי חז"ל כך הוא כי יכול להיות שאדם נברא להיות דעתו נוטה לטבע טוב או רע. ויש מידות מיוחדות שנתחזקו בו יותר מאחרים. כי הדות לא מאמנים שאדם אחד באיזו טבע שיהיה אלא יש לו רצון חפשי, ואפילו אם הוא נוטה לאיזה טבע הרבה יותר מאחרים, עליו לדעת שטבעו אינו עומד בפני הרצון לשנות את אופיו. למשל אדם שטבעו נוטה למדת הרעס קשה עליו ביותר להשליך מעליו מדתו המגונה ולהיות סבלן וארך אפים. אבל אין ספק שבידו לעשות כן. ואיש אחר שמלידה נטוע בו מדת הסבלנות נקל עליו העבודה הזאת אבל בטח שיש לו מדות אחרות קשות ורעות העומדות בפיו. כללו של דבר כי המידות שנולדו מלידה ומתגדלם ומתחזקם עם גידול האדם, בכחו להתגבר ולהשתלט עליהן ולהיות צדיק וטוב כפי בחירתו. וכך שינינו במסכת נדה (טז): דרש רב חנינא בר פפא: אותו מלאך הממונה על ההריון לילה שמו, ונוטל טיפה ומעמידה לפני הקב"ה ואומר לפניו רבש"ע טפה זו מה תהא עליה גבור או חלש, חכם או טפש, עשיר או עני ואילו רשע או צדיק לא קאמר כדר" חנינא דאמר הכל בידי שמים חוץ מיראת שמים שנאמר "ועתה ישראל מה ה' אלוקיך שואל מעמך כי אם ליראה" וכו'. וצריך לחשוב שהבחירה להיות טוב או רע תמיד בידיים של האדם.

אז איך אפשר להלחם ביצר הרע שמטמטם את הלב? בתבלין של תורה.

אמרו חז"ל על הפסוק ואלה המשפטים אשר תשים לפניהם, מה הראשונים מסיני אף אלו מסיני. ומקשים המפרשים וכי יש להעלות על הדעת שמשם אמר שזאת מדעתו בלי רשות הקב"ה? ואפשר לומר ע"פ מה דאמר הרמב"ן על הפסוק ואלו המשפטים אשר תשים לפניהם, אמאי מתחיל קודם בהלכות עבדים דוקא? ואמר כי רצה להקדים להם המשפטים כאשר היה בעשרת הדברות, דהיינו כמו שבעשרת הדברות מתחיל באנוכי ה' אלוקיך, ולא עבדים לעבדים גם כאן התחיל בהלכות עבדים. ולהסביר זה נראה לי דהנה איתא המדרש על הפסוק ואלה המשפטים מה שאמרו חז"ל "בבוקר ניתנה התורה ובערה נתנו המשפטים." פירש דבבוקר נתן הקב"ה את העשרת הדברות כמו דכתיב ויהי ביום השלישי בהיות בוקר, דהתורה ניתנה בבוקר, דכמו שבבוקר בהיר לראות כך כשאמר הקב"ה את העשרת הדברות היתה בהיר לכל בני ישראל. והיינו כשאמר הדיבור של אנוכי ה' אלוקיך היתה ברור שאנו עבדים להקב"ה ולא עבדים לעבדים. ויותר מזה דכשאמר הקב"ה אנוכי ה' אלוקיך היתה כמו הדיבור של יהי רקיע בשמים דהוא דבר שאנו רואים אותו במציאות ואין שום אדם חולק עליו לומר דאין רקיע בשמים. כך כשאמר הקב"ה אנוכי ה' אלוקיך היתה ברור בלי שום פגם דאנו עבדים לה' בלבד. אבל בערב דהיינו כשישראל בגלות ואינם רואים את התורה ומצות בבהירות אז נתנו המשפטים. וזהו הפשט בהרמב"ן דרצה להקדיש המשפטים כמו שהיה בעשרת הדברות, דכמו שהתם היה הכל בבהירות כך צריך להיות במשפטים בבהירות בלי שום פגם. וזהו הפשט דמה הראשונים מסיני דהיינו שהיתה הכל ברור אצל בני ישראל אף אלו מסיני דהמשפטים נמי צריכין להיות ברור אצל כל אדם.
